The Argument

- 1. For those who deny the necessity of baptism as a part of salvation, many will point to events that led the one of the two thieves ending up in paradise.
- 2. Their contention is that this sinner has his sins forgiven without being required to being baptized.
- 3. They say that this example exempts all others from having to be baptized.
- 4. Although they will say baptism is a good work, it is only an outward sign of an inward change.

Where agreement can be found

- 1. The thief was a sinner.
- 2. The thief showed a great amount of faith.
- 3. The thief was saved that day from horrible destination.
