Did Jesus die for me?

Ephesians 1:3–6 (ESV)

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him. In love He predestined us for adoption to Himself as sons [*and daughters*] through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of His will, to the praise of His glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved.

Acts

Ephesians 1:11-12 (ESV) ¹¹ In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, ¹² so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory.

Five Points of Calvinism (TULIP)

- Total Depravity: through Adam and Eve's fall, every person is born sinful
- Unconditional Election: God "saves" those he wishes; concept of predestination
- Limited Atonement: Jesus died for the chosen only, not for everyone.
- Irresistible Grace: God's grace is given freely; it cannot be earned or denied
- Perseverance of the "saints": those elected by God have full power to interpret the will of God


