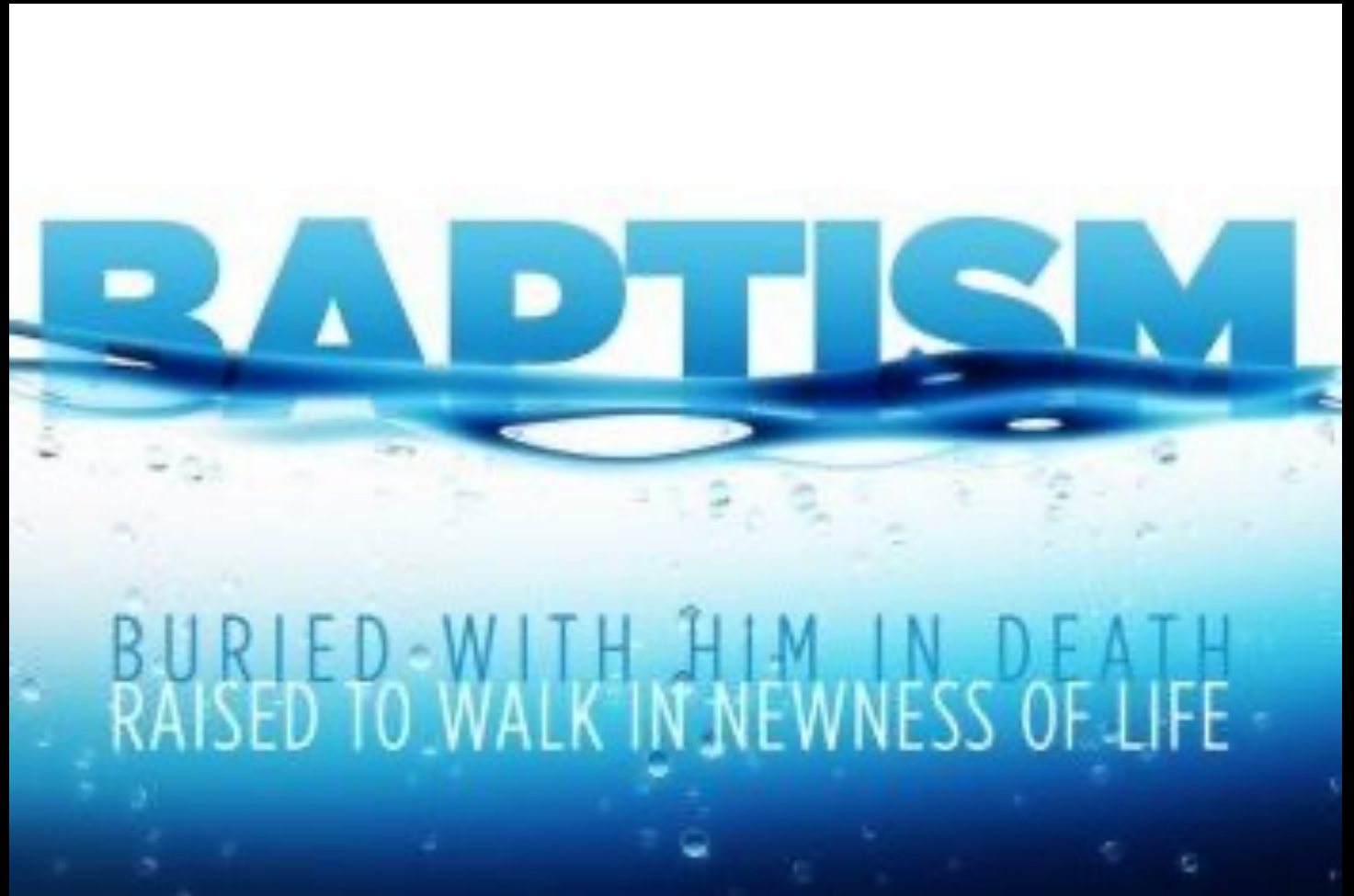

What God's Laws of Pardon?

God's First Law of Pardon:

- John 3:16 – 17
- Mark 16:15 – 16
- Ephesians 2:8 – 9





God's Second Law of Pardon:

- 1 John 3:3
- Romans 6:1 – 2
- 1 John 1:6 – 10
